

First Responder Course

Includes the latest First Aid and CPR Guidelines. Meets federal regulations and a variety of provincial and territorial regulations for Advanced First Aid.

This course is designed to teach First Responders advanced first aid techniques for sustaining life, preventing further injuries, and caring for illnesses and injuries until the next level of medical personnel arrives.

Prerequisite	CPR Level C or Level HCP
Duration	40–44 hours with flexible scheduling options
Instructor	Certified Red Cross First Responder Instructor or Emergency Medical Responder Instructor
Completion	100% attendance, evaluation on practical situation simulation (trauma- or medical-based scenario), and 80% min. passing grade at written exam
Certification	3-year certification in First Responder, CPR Level HCP, and AED*
Recertification	20 hours; includes CPR Level HCP


